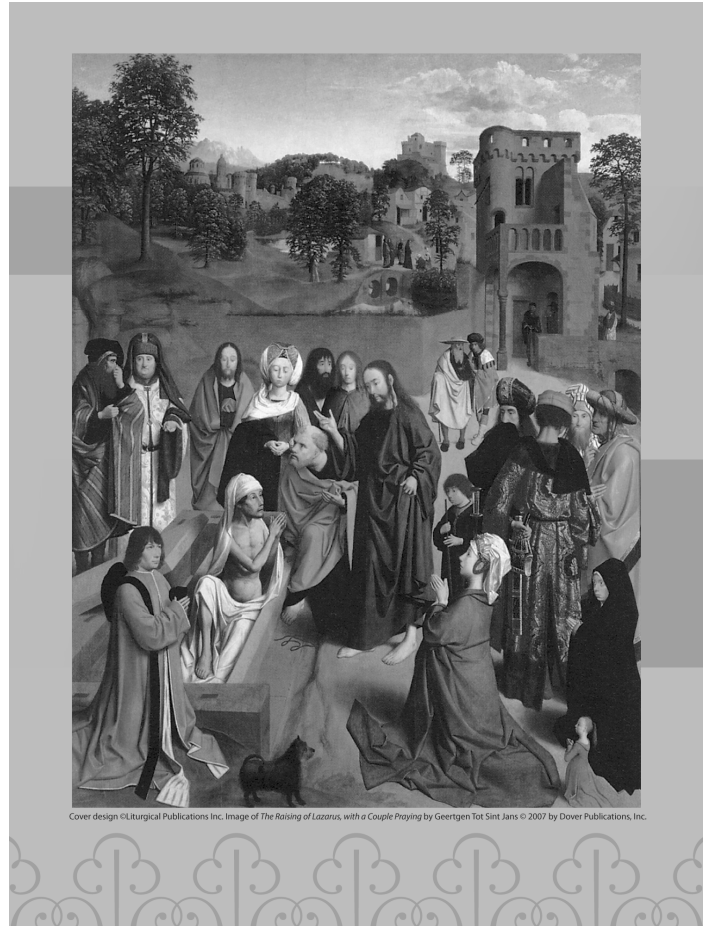

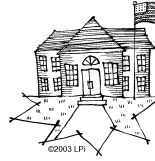

**School News** So why do we cover the cross the last two weeks of Lent? It started in the early Middle Ages, when the cross was often a richly jeweled emblem of triumph. Churches chose to veil the cross as a symbol to convey the pared down nature of Lent. A bonus symbolism emerged in modern times, as the veiling had the appearance of a cocoon, as though the transfiguration were about to occur.

So why are the statues covered? That, actually, has a different origin. It used to be that penitents were sealed with ashes, and then sent away from the church to do their penance and fasting, not to return until the Triduum. In those times, it was not uncommon for the entire congregation to keep the fast out of compassion for the penitents (kind of a "but for the grace of God, go I" thing). The church recognized it didn't want the whole congregation staying away, so they veiled parts of the altar with something called a hunger curtain, allowing the penitents to attend services, and the hunger curtain came down in great joy on the eve of Easter, as the penitents' sins were washed clean.

In our Catholic faith, symbolism is so rich and so important. Catholic schools have the time to devote to this all-important facet of our religion. Why not consider a Catholic education for your child or grandchild? You'll be glad you did! Inspire. Challenge. Engage.
