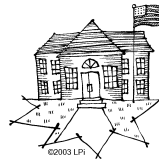
Happy Easter – Wesolego Alleluja

Each year, as the Easter Triduum (Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday) nears, the anticipation builds. During these three days, we mark the passion and death of Jesus as we wait for the most important day of the liturgical calendar – Easter!

Commencing with the Easter vigil on Holy Saturday evening, our hearts are open to the Light of Christ – Lumen Christi – giving way to a joyous season. Easter joy cannot be contained in one day, so for 50 days leading up to Pentecost Sunday, the Church celebrates Christ's victory over sin and death. Yes, it is Easter, and the Church cannot contain her joy – Alleluia! During this holiest of seasons, we not only commemorate the dying and rising of Jesus, which restores our lives, but also the new life brought to our Church.
