3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

After reading today's Gospel,
I found myself wondering
what would be the kind of
call for which I would leave
at once what I was doing as
Simon Peter and Andrew did.



I know if my next-door
neighbor with a disabled daughter would call for help I
would run over right away. The same goes if I got a
phone call for help from my ninety-three-year-old
mother. If there were an accident in front of my house I
would run out right away. And if someone important
called—the president, the mayor, the bishop (all unlikely
probabilities), my boss—I would respond. I tried to think
for whom I would get up from my work and leave
immediately, and I was hard-pressed to come up with an
answer.

All this leads me to wonder about the Gospel. Did Peter
and Andrew already know Jesus? Were James and John
familiar with his teaching? Matthew doesn't give us much
to go on other than the fact that Jesus had started preach-
ing a message of repentance and the advent of the king-
dom of heaven. So what made them get up at once and
go?

Certainly the spontaneous response of these four fisher-
men to Jesus involved the action of God's grace. Maybe
they had already considered getting out of the business.
Or possibly they were mesmerized by this charismatic
preacher. For whatever reason, Peter and Andrew, James
and John chose to cooperate with God's grace by
responding to the call that Jesus gave to them. Their
response changed their lives forever. We know they still
did fishing, even after the Resurrection (see Jn 21), but
they became apostles and spread the good news of Jesus
throughout the world. God's call to each of us may not be
as dramatic as someone walking up to us in the work-
place and saying, "Follow me." But the call comes just
the same. Are we ready to cooperate with God's grace?

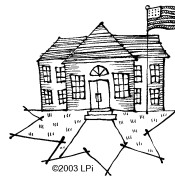

In 1969 the 2nd Vatican Council met and, through the guidance of the Holy Spirit made a decision to have the Mass translated from Latin to the people's vernacular, which in our case, was English. Many of you remember this change, some with sadness and some with joy. So what does this have to do with the upcoming change? Well...when the translations took place, the meanings of many of the original words were also changed. As you know, one incorrect word in a sentence can change the meaning and intent of that sentence.

These changes won't take place until Advent, but during the year we will be educating and introducing you to the new wording. Change isn't easy, but this change is necessary if we want to be more authentic to the Mass as it was intended. May God bless us with openness and patience during this time of change.
