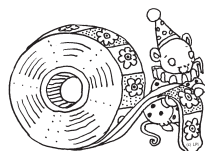

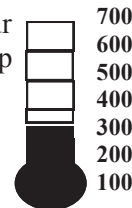

## Feast Days of the Week

**Monday, Aug. 1 St. Alphonsus Liguori** 1696-1787  
Alphonsus was born in Naples, Italy. Visiting the local Hospital for Incurables in 1723, Alphonsus had a vision and felt called to consecrate his life solely to God. He founded the Redemptorists in 1732 and became Bishop of St Agatha of the Goths near Naples in 1762. For 13 years Alphonsus fed the poor, instructed families, reorganized the seminary and religious houses, taught theology, and wrote works that have survived through the years. Canonized in 1839, he was proclaimed a Doctor of the Church in 1871.

**Thursday, Aug 4 St. John Vianney** 1786 - 1859  
Known as the Curé d'Ars. As a young farm hand, he taught other children their prayers. Assigned in 1818 to the parish of Ars, a tiny village near Lyons, France, he would spend 40 years there as parish priest. He was gifted with the discernment of spirits, prophecy, hidden knowledge, and working miracles. Crowds came to hear him preach, and to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation. By 1855 there were 20,000 pilgrims a year to Ars – the government had to run extra trains. Pope Pius X proposed him as a model for all parish priests.

**Friday, Aug 5 St. Dominic** 1170 - 1221  
Born of wealthy Spanish nobility, Dominic conducted a lifelong apostolate among heretics. In 1215 he founded the Order of Friars Preachers (Dominicans) and an order of nuns, the Dominican Sisters. In a vision, Our Lady told him to say the Rosary daily, and to teach it to all who would listen. One day he met a beggar whom he embraced and told: 'You are my companion and must walk with me. If we hold together, no earthly power can withstand us.' The beggar was Saint Francis of Assisi (1181 – 1226).

**Saturday, Aug 6 Transfiguration of the Lord**  
This unique event in the Gospel occurred when Jesus took his three closest companions, Peter, James and John, up a mountain and was transfigured: 'His face shone like the sun and his clothes became as dazzling as light.'
