This collection offers a wonderful opportunity to support hands-on efforts to help people in need. Please give generously. Your gift does make a difference!

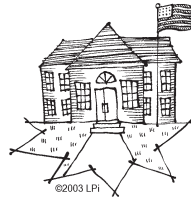
