## Thoughts on the Gospel

‘Without a wedding garment? The last section of today's gospel doesn't seem to fit. It may have been a separate story, but the author of Matthew's gospel sees it as a unit. The first section describes a king's disappointment at the response to an invitation. This probably refers to God's sadness at people's indifference to Jesus. Others are invited in their place – all of those who will come to Christ.

‘The final part of the story presents the king's anger at one of the guests who isn't properly dressed. How could the guest be ready if he's been dragged in at the last minute? If you just came off the street, would you be likely to have one?

The answer may be that God provides the right clothes for all of us: a suit of love. If we accept an invitation without caring about the guest of honor, why should we bother?’

**Anointing of the Sick** If you have a loved one whose health is deteriorating or who is nearing death, please know that you can call the parish office and ask for a priest to come and share the sacrament of the anointing of the sick. In years gone by, people waited until a person was taking their last breaths to call a priest for Last Rites. While there is still a Last Rites ritual, the Church has put more emphasis on the anointing of the sick to be shared when a very sick or dying person can be alert enough to participate in the prayer. Emergencies happen and sudden rapid changes in health happen and most hospitals have chaplains on call to deal with immediate requests. If you want one of our priests to come to your home or health facility, just call the parish office and leave a message for one of the priests. They check their messages frequently and will respond as soon as they are able.

## Feast Days of the Week

Friday, October 14 *St. Callistus I*: Born into slavery, Callistus led a tumultuous life. While serving time in the tin mines of Sardinia for a crime he did not commit, he was ransomed by other Christians and earned his freedom. Callistus was put in charge of the Roman public burial grounds, today still known as St. Callistus Cemetery. He is the patron saint of cemetery workers.

Saturday, October 15 *St. Teresa of Jesus (Avila)* 1515-1582: Founder of the Discalced Carmelites and Doctor of the Church. St Teresa spoke of prayer as 'nothing else than an intimate sharing between friends; it means taking time frequently to be alone with him who we know loves us. The important thing is not to think much but to love much and so do that which best stirs you to love. Love is not great delight but desire to please God in everything.'

## The following are a few others reasons why the rosary should be prayed often, even daily:

'Walls of Jericho did not fall faster on the blare of the Jozue's trumpets than the false instructions disappeared after the open-hearted rosary prayer. The pool in Jerusalem was not so curative for wounds of human's body as the rosary is the medicine for wounded hearts.' (St. Alfons de Liguori)

"Among all the devotions approved by the Church none has been so favored by so many miracles as the devotion of the Most Holy Rosary" (Pope Pius IX).

"Say the Rosary every day to obtain peace for the world" (Our Lady of Fátima).

"There is no surer means of calling down God's blessings upon the family . . . than the daily recitation of the Rosary" (Pope Pius XII).

"We do not hesitate to affirm again publicly that we put great confidence in the Holy Rosary for the healing of evils of our times" (Pope Pius XII).

"No one can live continually in sin and continue to say the Rosary: either they will give up sin or they will give up the Rosary" (Bishop Hugh Doyle). "The Rosary is a magnificent and universal prayer for the needs of the Church, the nations and the entire world" (Pope John XXIII).

"The Rosary is the compendium of the entire Gospel" (Pope Paul VI).

"Meditation on the mysteries of the Rosary . . . can be an excellent preparation for the celebration of those same mysteries in the liturgical actions [i.e. the Mass] and can also become a continuing echo thereof" (Pope Paul VI).

'It is no problem in life which could not be resolved with help of the rosary.' (sister Lucia from Fatima)

"My impression is that the Rosary is of the greatest value not only according to the words of Our Lady at Fátima, but according to the effects of the Rosary one sees throughout history. My impression is that Our Lady wanted to give ordinary people, who might not know how to pray, this simple method of getting closer to God" (Sister Lucia, one of the seers of Fátima).

"How beautiful is the family that recites the Rosary every evening" (Pope John Paul II).

Pope John Paul II has called the Rosary his "favorite prayer," after the Mass and the Liturgy of the Hours.

St. Louis de Montfort warns us against both the ignorant and scholars who regard the Rosary as something of little importance. . . "the Rosary is a priceless treasure inspired by God."

## The Testimony of Catalina on the Holy Mass

*Continued from last week*



... And you say that you have not hurt the Lord...? "You arrive at the last minute when the procession of the celebrants to the Altar has begun... and you are going to participate in the Mass without previous preparation..." "All right my Mother, say no more to me," I replied. "You do not have to remind me of more things because I am going to die of grief and shame."

"Why must you all arrive at the last moment? You should arrive earlier so that you can say a prayer and ask the Lord to send His Holy Spirit, that the Holy Spirit may grant you a spirit of peace and cleanse you of the spirit of the world, your worries, your problems and your distractions in order that you may be able to live this so sacred a moment. However, you arrive almost when the celebration is about to begin, and you participate in Mass as if it were an ordinary event, without any spiritual preparation. Why? This is the greatest of Miracles. You are going to live the moment when the Most High God gives His greatest gift and you do not appreciate it."

That was enough. I felt so bad that I had more than enough to ask for forgiveness from God. Not only for the offenses of that day, but also for all the times that, like so many other people, I had waited for the priest to finish his homily before I entered the Church. I asked forgiveness for the times when I did not know or refused to understand what it meant to be there, and for the times perhaps, when having my soul full of more serious sin, I had dared to participate in the Holy Mass. It was a Feast day and the Gloria was to be recited. Our Lady said: "**Glorify and bless the Most Holy Trinity with all your love, in your acknowledgement of being the Trinity's creature.**"

How different was that Gloria! Suddenly I saw myself in a far off place full of light, before the Majestic Presence of the Throne of God. With how much love I went on thanking Him, as I



repeated: "For your immense Glory we praise You, we bless You, we worship You, we glorify You, we give You thanks, Lord, God, Heavenly King, God the Father Almighty." And I evoked the paternal countenance of the Father, full of kindness... "Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father, Lord God, Lamb of God, You take away the sins of the world..." And Jesus was in front of me, with that face full of tenderness and Mercy..." For You alone are the Holy One, You alone are the Lord, You alone are the most High Jesus Christ with the Holy Spirit..." the God of beautiful Love.... He, Who at that moment, was filling my entire being with joy..
